SUBJECT: PARKS, TRAILS, HISTORIC RESOURCES AND OPEN SPACE FUNDING REQUEST

PROCESS UPDATES - CONTINUED FROM AUGUST 12, 2024

SUMMARY

In 2023, a process for accepting funding applications for the Parks, Trails, Historic Resources, and Open Space (PTHROS) Sales Tax funds was established. It included staff accepting and managing applications that were vetted through the respective fund-related advisory boards. The purpose of which was to manage all requests and for the advisory boards to make recommendations regarding funding priorities.

Learning from how this process was implemented during 2023, staff proposes to adjust the application review process so that staff may better represent the Board of County Commissioner's interests. Staff will continue to accept requests to manage and organize them as they are received throughout the year but will provide them to the Board as a first step so that input may be garnered from the onset. Based on that initial input, staff will manage the funding request through the review process as directed by the Board.

The attached diagrams provide an overview this proposed process for each fund category.








- Property becomes available for purchase

Budget Adoption

- Capital Maintenance List includes asset and equipment replacements determined by their life expectancy and safety issues, acquisitions, supply requirements, scheduled renovations, and unforeseen circumstances
- Ideas come from BOCC, Public, Advisory Board and other municipalities
- Staff gathers information and prepares their budget requests, including necessary project details such as scope of work, quote updates, and others
- Operation and Maintenance budget requests are presented to the Advisory Board for review and discussion to ensure alignment and understanding
- Capital Project requests are evaluated by the Advisory Board based on the predetermined criteria

Staff submits budget requests with Advisory Board recommendations to the Budget Department following the current budget process

- Budget reviews the requests for need, safety and alignment with BOCC priorities
- Budget interacts with staff to address and clarify all necessary questions
- BOCC selects projects to be included in the Budget Book

There are also several historic structures on the property that require structural stabilization and restoration.
