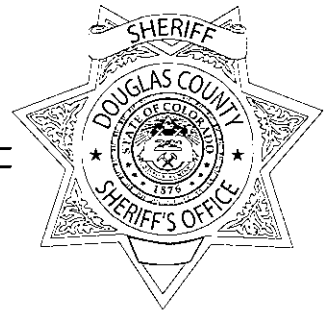

SUBJ: Lockheed Martin "Resource Deputy"

I am requesting the addition of one (1) Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Deputy Sheriff position to act as a "Resource Deputy" to serve Lockheed Martin's facilities located within unincorporated Douglas County.

Lockheed Martin operates facilities within unincorporated Douglas County. These facilities represent critical infrastructure and Lockheed Martin is requesting a dedicated law enforcement presence to address security needs, ensure rapid emergency response, and provide direct support to employees and assets. This Deputy Sheriff will act as the primary liaison between Lockheed Martin and the Sheriff's Office, offering proactive problem-solving, situational awareness, and on-site engagement to address security concerns in real-time. Given the sensitive nature of these operations and the importance to the community, a full-time Resource Deputy is essential to maintaining safety and reinforcing the Sheriff's Office's commitment to public safety.

Lockheed Martin has agreed to fully fund this position, including salary, benefits, vehicle, and equipment costs. The total first-year financial impact for this position is approximately **\$316,300**, all of which will be covered by Lockheed Martin through a formal agreement. The on-going annual cost will be **\$189,200**.
