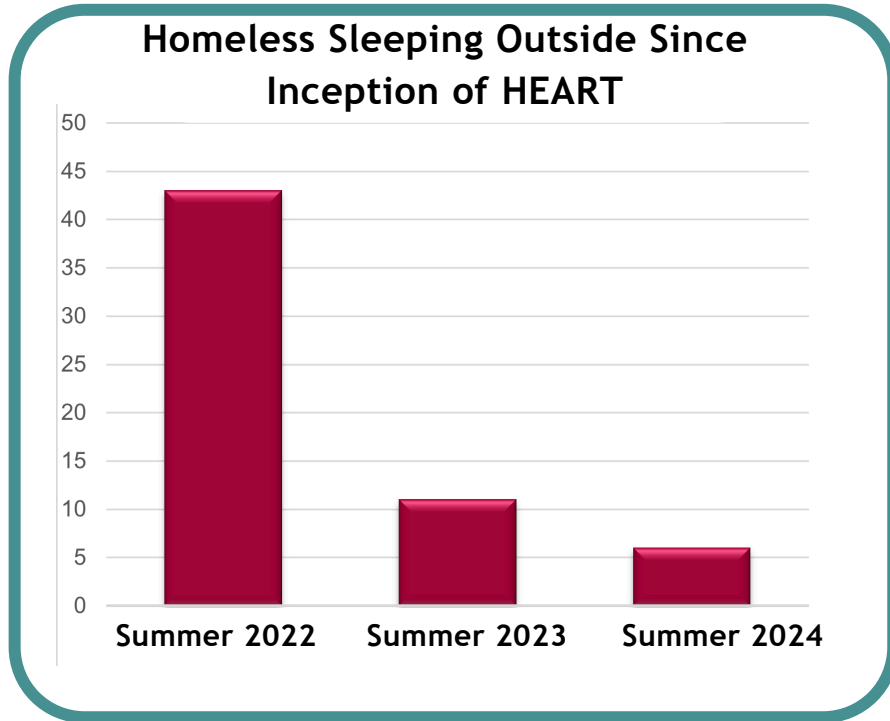
No encampments of more than one individual found.
